



In the emotional aftermath of the September 11, 2001, attacks, people from all walks of life created and encountered memorials to those who were murdered. Vernacular art appeared almost everywhere—on walls, trees, playgrounds, vehicles, houses, tombstones, and even on bodies. This outpouring of grief and other acts of remembrance impelled photographer Jonathan Hyman to document and so preserve these largely impermanent, spontaneous expressions. His collection of 20,000 photographs, along with field notes and personal interviews, constitutes a unique archive of 9/11 public memory.

In *The Landscapes of 9/11*, Hyman offers readers a representative sampling of his photographs and also relates his own story in a clear and detailed narrative. He is joined by a diverse group of scholars and museum professionals, including editors Edward Linenthal and Christiane Gruber, who use the Hyman collection to investigate the cultural functions of memorial practices in the United States and beyond, including Northern Ireland, the Palestinian West Bank, and Iran.

2013-2014 Hunting and Fishing License Sales

The **highlighted text in blue** below are links to open publications on the DEC Website.

License sales for the 2013-2014 hunting and fishing season will go on sale statewide Monday, August 12th. The new fishing license year begins October 1st. If you have had a previous license from the new system (little green tag, yellow or tan license) just bring in your Driver's I.D. Otherwise you may need to bring in previous license from any year that shows you have had a sportsman's license. Prices are the same as last year. Senior Licenses are now issued at age 70 years old and over.

Doe permit applications will no longer be mailed to hunters. You will have a choice of two deer management units only in those units that have second permits. The deadline to apply is October 1st. The second round of leftovers will be let out on November 1st, first come, first serve. Chart of units that require preference point, those that have seconds, or the probability of low, medium and high is available at Bethel Town Hall.

Sullivan County Doe Permits: You must have a preference point for a doe permit in Unit 3H or Unit 3K and there are no second permits in either unit. Preference Points that you have from last year are stored in your computer file by the DEC and will appear on your sales screen when purchasing your license; they are also printed on your current license. Preference Points increase your chances of selection but do not guarantee a doe permit. Preference points are won and lost on your permit selection. Landowner's (50 continuous acres or more) are guaranteed a permit on their first selection even if the unit requires a preference point.

Closed Units for Doe permits (not available): 3A, 4L, 4U, 5A, 5C, 5F, 5G, 5H, 5J, 6A, 6F, 6J, and 6N.

Dear Resident:

The Kauneonga Lake Sewer Department (KLSD) anticipates conducting 3 days of leak tests in the sanitary sewer system beginning August 20, 2013. A non-toxic smoke will be blown into the system to reveal leaks that allow storm water and other surface waters to enter. Locating and correcting these leaks will conserve expensive capacity at the treatment facility. A record of leaks will be made.

The smoke is manufactured specifically for this purpose, leaves no residual or stains, and has no effects on plants or animals. It has a distinctive, but not unpleasant odor. The visible smoke and odor only last a few minutes, where there is adequate ventilation.

The smoke should not enter your home. However, if smoke does enter your home any of the following items are the probable cause:

The vents connected to your building's sewer system lateral are inadequate, defective, improperly installed.

The traps under sinks, tubs, basins, showers, floor drains, etc. are dry, defective, improperly installed or missing.

The pipes, connections and seals of the building's sewer system are damaged, defective, have plugs missing, or are improperly installed.

During the week prior to August 20, pour water down ALL drains in your home or building to ensure that all traps are full.

If traces of the smoke or its odor enter your house or building, it is an indication that odor from the sewer system may also be entering. This can be unpleasant, dangerous, and a potential health hazard. The location, identification and correction of the source of any smoke entering your house is urgently advised.

The KLSD can provide assistance in locating the source of smoke entering your house. However, correction of any defects in the pipes and sewer on private property is the responsibility of the owner. If smoke is observed in your home and the source is not readily identified or you have any questions, please call either Jim McBride, Sewer Superintendent at (845) 798-6643 or Mike Collins, Plant Operator at (845) 807-4175.
