EmPower NY is a NYSERDA program to help low-income residents reduce their use of electricity, improve efficiency of their heating systems and increase comfort of their homes. EmPower services are provided free to households who are HEAP eligible. Services include high-efficiency lighting, replacement of inefficient refrigerators and freezer, heating system upgrades, insulation and air sealing, and health and safety testing to ensure the home is properly ventilated and gases are not escaping into the living space.
