BETHEL ACHIEVES BRONZE CLIMATE SMART COMMUNITY CERTIFICATION

You might have seen Town of Bethel Supervisor, Dan Sturm, arriving at the Government Center in Monticello or otherwise attending to town business in the town's fully electric bright green and white car. The acquisition of the EV car and the installation of an electric vehicle charging station are but two of the projects that Bethel undertook as a Climate Smart Community (CSC). For those initiatives and many others, the Town of Bethel has today been recognized as a "Bronze-Certified" Climate Smart Community by the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation—only the 20th municipality in the State of New York to achieve certification status.

The New York State Climate Smart Communities program is a unique state-local partnership to meet the State's goals of reducing greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions, prepare for a



changing climate and save tax payers' money. "We are thrilled to have achieved this important milestone," commented Bethel Town Supervisor Daniel Sturm. "Our Bronze Certification recognizes the significant projects that our town has undertaken to conserve energy, move to renewable energy, reduce greenhouse gas emissions and otherwise make Bethel a more environmentally sustainable community. And it will also favorably position the Town to secure grants in the future to undertake additional projects."

In November 2013, the Bethel Town Board adopted a resolution recognizing the threats that climate change pose to our local and global environments and pledging to take steps to ensure the long-term economic and ecological sustainability of the town. Since then, Bethel's Green Committee has worked closely with Town officials and staff to promote energy conservation and environmental sustainability. "For the past five years Bethel has been fortunate to have an active Green Committee comprised of town board members and community volunteers", said Town Board member Vicky Simpson, a member since the Committee's inception. "We have worked tirelessly to research opportunities and help guide the Town on energy-related initiatives. We have laid the ground work for several projects and hope to see them all to completion."

Green Committee Co-Chairs Jeff Allison and Karen London expressed special thanks to advisors Stephen Stuart and Carol Roig, whose expertise has guided the committee since its inception, initially as part of the Sullivan Alliance for Sustainable Development and currently under the leadership of Heather Brown in the Sullivan County Office of Sustainability. The Committee is also grateful for assistance from NYS-DEC, Federal EPA, and Niklas Moran of the Hudson Valley Regional Council.

Allison and London are especially excited by the next round of projects. In the works now is a community solar project to be sited on the Town's capped landfill, potentially offering significant discounts on electricity rates to Bethel and Sullivan County residents, as well as annual lease payments to the Town. "To enable the Town and local residents to access affordable, renewable energy and, at the same time, profitably use the Town's otherwise unusable landfill site is a win-win-win all-around," commented Karen London. "We hope to see the installation up and running by next year."

"Our other exciting project is to convert all of the Town's existing and aging street lights to efficient, cost-and energy-saving LED street lights," added Jeffrey Allison, who also spearheaded an exhaustive accounting analysis and baseline report of the Town's GHG emissions. "We are currently working with the NY Power Authority on the streetlight initiative. As more Sullivan County towns join the street light consortium, the Town will realize even greater aggregate purchasing power and municipal savings."

"We are proud that the Town of Bethel has achieved Bronze certification", said Supervisor Sturm. "Now we are ready to go for Silver!"


2nd Annual Nourish your Neighbor Healthy Food Drive Collection
